

## THE SUPERVISORY RELATIONSHIP: CLINICAL THEORY & PRACTICE

### **WORKSHOP SUMMARY**

This workshop is designed to help meet an increasing need for professionally trained clinical social work supervisors. This need is the result of changing licensing requirements and standards of practice, along with our evolving appreciation for the complexities of clinical work. With these developments in mind, clinicians currently supervising privately and in agencies, as well as clinicians with at least several years of practice experience who are interested in becoming supervisors, are invited to increase their understanding of the theories and processes that inform clinical supervision. Some topics to be covered are educational assessment of clinicians, the 'teach vs. treat' dilemma, parallel process, including the permutations of transference and countertransference, and the distribution of power between supervisor and supervisees. Attention will also be paid to the differing contexts for practice (i.e. agency vs. private practice, individual vs. group supervision) as well as varying levels of supervisee experience (student, new, or experienced professional), along with issues of diversity in the supervisory relationship. The presenters will introduce illustrative case material for discussion, and participants are also invited to bring in supervisory vignettes and questions about the supervisory process for comment and discussion.

### **OBJECTIVES**

Participants will:

- Develop tools for establishing and maintaining a successful supervisory relationship.
- Discuss the differences and similarities between supervision and treatment, including the significance of transference and countertransference.
- Articulate a supervisory model for her/his specific practice context.
